



# COVID-19 Communications

Working to safely return our staff and students to campus.

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## What we worked on last week:

- Asynchronous Wednesdays. This means that teachers will check-in with each of their classes during their assigned hour of class time during the school day for 15 minutes. For example, 1st period will meet sometime between 8-9 am, 2nd period between 9:15-10:15 am, etc. New work will be assigned during this check-in time. Teachers in special programs and in special circumstances may request students attend the entire period with advance notice to the students.

## What's next:

- Teacher prep time: There will be no Hub time during the week of October 12 so teachers can use that time to modify their lessons to the new hybrid format. Our board of education will meet October 13. Please refer to our website for agenda and Zoom details. As schools open, we anticipate increased COVID-19 cases. Our protocol states that principals will notify their school communities when a positive case is reported on campus. The district office will send a districtwide communication to all staff upon each reported COVID-19 case. We are looking forward to having students on campus on October 12 and beginning our way to a new normal where students and teachers can interact in-person.

## Challenges ahead:

- Ensuring appropriate staffing for October 12 reopening.
- To ensure that programs are kept intact at the home school, only graduation requirements and UC/CSU a-g courses will be offered in the RSVL Academy. Students in special programs (IB/AP/PLTW) will remain at their home school.

## Techie news:

- Beginning January 1, 2021, the district will include a dashboard of data on intradistrict COVID-19 cases on our district website. Students must complete a daily digital health screening prior to coming on to campus. An instructional video will be sent later this week.

## Campus news:

- Wellness Centers are active and ready to offer additional support to students. Please reach out to your school site administration for contact information. Face coverings are required to be worn on campus for all students and staff. Only students who have medical exemptions are permitted to have alternative measures in place. Students who do not comply cannot be on campus.
