Working to safely return our staff and students to campus

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What we worked on last week:

- Planning for the return of our students. Survey results indicate 50% of students chose to remain in distance learning and 30% chose to return to school in a mixed hybrid model.

What's next:

- Ensuring our numbers are accurate to plan occupancy in our classrooms.
- Connecting with every family who has a student with special needs to determine their level of participation in the mixed hybrid model.

Challenges ahead:

- Ensuring appropriate staffing for October 12 reopening.
- Childcare remains a challenge for our staff.
- While schools are closed for part of the week or day, staff will qualify for Family First Coronavirus Relief Act leave or accommodations, such as working from home.
- This will impact the number of teachers allowed to teach from home.

Techie news:

- Each teacher will receive a bluetooth microphone to enable instruction without being directly tied to their digital devices.
- We are providing teachers with additional cameras to capture a wider display of their actions while teaching, helping to teach an in-person lesson as an actual lesson rather than a Zoom lesson.
- Each school received a shipment of headphones for students who are not able to provide their own headphones.

Fun news:

- The corpse flower at Roseville High School has a sibling arriving sometime this week. RHS Science Teacher CJ Addington has accomplished a rare feat.
