THE SCHOOL

Woodcreek High School (WHS) is a public suburban high school located in the city of Roseville and surrounded by the communities of Antelope, Rocklin and Sacramento. It is one of five comprehensive high schools in the Roseville Joint Union High School District. Woodcreek High School opened in September of 1994. The school serves 1,947 students in grades 9-12. The school mascot is the Timberwolf.

Woodcreek is on a four-by-four block schedule with the school year split into two 18-week terms. Students are enrolled in 4 classes each term, which is equivalent to 2 traditional semesters. Therefore, each semester-long course at Woodcreek is equal to a yearlong course in a traditional high school.

MARKING SYSTEM

Letter grades of A, B, C, D, and F are used. A cumulative grade point average is computed using a 4.0+ scale and includes all work completed in grades 9 through 12. The transcript includes both weighted and unweighted GPA as well as a State GPA, which excludes freshman grades, as well as all physical education grades. Advanced Placement, Honors, and some Community College classes, that are Board approved and transferable to the University of California, are weighted. If a course is repeated, the higher grade is calculated into the GPA.
