COMMUNITY

Oakmont High School opened its doors in 1966 and is the second of six high schools in the Roseville Joint Union High School District (RJUHS). OHS currently serves a diverse population of approximately 1,350 students from within the Roseville and surrounding communities. Oakmont's commitment to excellence has been part of our tradition for 57 years. Our Vision Statement, "Honoring our tradition of excellence with a commitment to the future," reflects both the importance of our history in this community and our recognition that we must prepare students for a constantly changing world.

SCHOOL

Oakmont is a four-by-four block schedule with the school year split into two 18-week terms. Students are enrolled in four classes each term, which is equivalent to two traditional semesters. Each semester long course is equal to a yearlong course in a traditional high school.

MARKING SYSTEM

Letter grades of A, B, C, D, and F are used. A cumulative grade point average is computed using a 4.0+ scale and includes all work completed in grades 9 through 12. The transcript includes both weighted and unweighted GPA as well as a State GPA that excludes freshman grades and physical education grades. Advanced Placement, Honors (excludes Honors English 10), and International Baccalaureate classes that are Board approved are weighted. If a course is repeated, the higher grade is calculated into the GPA. In accordance with California Assembly Bill 104, in response to the Covid-19 pandemic, students were given the option to select either a letter grade or Credit/No Credit for courses taken from 4th quarter 2020 through the end of the 4th quarter 2021.

HEALTH CAREERS ACADEMY

Students in the Academy take English, Science and Social Science classes with an integrated curriculum focused on healthcare. Academy students must also take three classes; Medical Science & Terminology, Advanced Medical Sciences, and Medical Trends Seminar, in which they learn medical terminology, nursing skills, and job seeking skills. Strong emphasis is placed on soft skill development. Academy students have significant work-based learning experiences and may take Hospital Practicum, a 100-150 hour internship. Since classes are taken as a cohort, Health Academy students have less access to AP, IB and Honors courses.

CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION PATHWAYS (CTE)

A CTE Pathway is a sequence of three courses (Introductory, Concentrator, and Capstone) in an industry sector. The courses build on the knowledge and skills gained in the previous class, culminating in a Capstone course where students are expected to tackle real-world problems. Oakmont offers the following programs of study:
