



Safety is our priority.

The Roseville Joint Union High School District, the Roseville Police Department, and Placer County Sheriffs Department will not tolerate verbal or written threats, firearms, or weapons that might endanger the safety of students and staff.

We are providing the following information about how school, district officials, and law enforcement respond to tips, rumors, situations, or threats to school safety.

It is important that parents and students feel confident that the District will take appropriate steps to safeguard the safety of its students. In addition, there is an expectation and duty for parents and students to report any information that would possibly impact the safety of any school.

The District and law enforcement agencies place a high priority on maintaining safe campuses and will take all reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of our students. The District and parents must also be concerned about the problems that can be generated by reacting to hoaxes or unsubstantiated rumors.

In evaluating any threat, school officials will always take the safest course of action.

If school officials, with the assistance of law enforcement, determine that a threat is credible,

appropriate action such as locking down, evacuating, dismissing, or closing school, may be taken.

All tips and information are thoroughly investigated by school officials and law enforcement using the following process:

Investigation

- Gather all available information from the source(s) of the information
- Involve the Youth Services Officer (Police/Sheriff officer assigned to the school)
- Interview the student(s) or individual(s) suspected of being a threat to school safety
- Gather information from teachers, counselors, and school staff about the suspect
- Interview other students or individuals who may have information
- Contact the parents of the suspect
- Offer a **Crime Stopper** reward(s), if appropriate, to identify perpetrators—anonymous calls accepted (800) 923-8191
- Protect confidentiality of all parties, but especially students reporting safety concerns

Evaluation

- Evaluate the validity of the threat
- Determine if the suspect has the resources to carry out the threat
- Involve additional law enforcement personnel
- Conduct lawful searches (with law enforcement assistance, if appropriate)

Consequence

- Apply appropriate disciplinary consequences, including possible expulsion
- Report to appropriate law enforcement agency and arrest, when appropriate
- Seek restitution for any applicable damages
- Involve additional law enforcement and/or increase site security
- Referral to appropriate counseling services
