#### **Woodcreek Athletics Definition of Success:**

#### 3 Questions:

- 1. Did the athletes have fun? (On the field? Off? Practice? Games? Trips?)
- 2. Did the athlete's fundamentals and play improve throughout the year? (Wins? Improved stats? Improved evaluations? Increased confidence?)
- 3. Did the journey transform the athlete's lives for the better? (Are they better people for having participated?)

### **Woodcreek Athletic Department Common Language**

- 1. Transformational vs Transactional Coaching
  - a. Transformational coaching is giving individual consideration to developing athletes, as a whole, while understanding that the team is only as strong as its weakest athlete. Transforming lives for the better.
  - b. Transactional coaching is a series of transactions between coach and player where the bottom line is to win or accomplish tasks. All practices, drills, strategies, and techniques are focused on that end result.

### 2. Goal vs Purpose

- a. Goals are the result toward which effort is directed or aimed, a destination. Goal setting helps us accomplish something (Win the CVC Championship!).
- b. Purpose is the reason why something exists or is done. It's WHY we do it.

- It is imperative that we coach with a transformational purpose that nurtures successful people, not just successful athletes. Our goals, behaviors, interactions, and communications should reflect our purpose.

- We are not afraid to apologize and reconcile mistakes. We all make them. When a mistake is made publicly, we apologize publicly; when mistakes are made personally, we apologize personally.
- We will treat opposing coaches and teams with the honor true competitors deserve. We will accept defeat graciously and victory humbly.
- We will treat all referees, officials, and game managers with the utmost respect. They are imperfect and trying their best, just as we are.
- Regardless of our wins and losses, we will be successful if we carry out the above items.
