Notice to Parents of Roseville Joint Union High School District Students
Resources available for youth lacking fixed, regular or adequate housing

Homeless students face multiple challenges and barriers to success in school. The *Education for Homeless Children and Youth Program* provides resources and assistance to ensure that homeless students are enrolled in school and have the support and resources necessary for success. The education definition of a homeless individual is very different from the traditional perception of people with no place to live. The education definition means *someone who lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence*. This definition is much broader so that we can identify and help students who may be at risk of having difficulties in school due to an unstable housing situation.

Resources may be available to students who live:

- In emergency or transitional shelters
- In motels, hotels, trailer parks, campgrounds, abandoned in hospitals, awaiting foster care
- In cars, parks, public places, bus or train stations, abandoned buildings
- Temporarily doubled up with relatives or friends
- In temporary housing due to migrant work of their parents
- In a temporary situation due to foreclosure
