THE SCHOOL

Oakmont High School is a public high school located in the city of Roseville. It is surrounded by the communities of Citrus Heights, Rocklin and Sacramento. It is one of five comprehensive high schools in the Roseville Joint Union High School District. Oakmont High School opened in September of 1964.

Oakmont is on a four-by-four block schedule with the school year split into two 18-week terms. Students are enrolled in four classes each term, which is equivalent to two traditional semesters. Therefore, each semester-long course at Oakmont is equal to a yearlong course in a traditional high school.

The school serves approximately 1829 students in grades 9-12. The ethnicity and race makeup is as follows:

19.03% Hispanic or Latino of any race; .87% American Indian or Alaska Native not Hispanic; 7.33% Asian not Hispanic; .44% Pacific Islander not Hispanic; 5.25% Filipino not Hispanic; 3.34% African American not Hispanic; 58.34% White not Hispanic; 5.24% two or more races not Hispanic; .16% not reported.

MARKING SYSTEM

Letter grades of A, B, C, D, and F are used. A cumulative grade point average is computed using a 4.0+ scale and includes all work completed in grades 9 through 12. The transcript includes both weighted and unweighted GPA as well as a State GPA that excludes freshman grades, as well as physical education grades. Advanced Placement, Honors, and Community College classes that are Board approved and transferable to the University of California are weighted. If a course is repeated, the higher grade is calculated into the GPA.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES

Oakmont High School students may contribute to student literary productions such as the school newspaper and yearbook, be active in student government groups and leadership, as well as participate in band and theater productions. Volunteering within the community is strongly encouraged. Opportunities are available to participate in a wide range of interscholastic sports.
