THE SCHOOL

Roseville High School, a public school located 15 miles north of Sacramento, serves students in grades 9-12. The school was founded in 1912 as the first school in the Roseville Joint Union High School District. Roseville High School was honored by the California Department of Education with the 2017 California Gold Ribbon School Award and AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) National Demonstration site distinction. Roseville High School received a full six-year accreditation in 2015 from the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC). Roseville High School is on a four-by-four block schedule which allows students to explore more electives over their four years. The school features a wide variety of AP Courses and opportunities to explore careers through Career Technical Education courses in Media/Journalism, Culinary/Hospitality, Computer Science and Project Lead the Way Bio Medical and Engineering programs. In the 2021-2022 school year, Roseville High School plans to offer Dual Enrollment in Econ 1A, English 1 A, Sociology 1A, and Theater 10A. These are courses students take at the high school for college credit, while fulfilling high school graduation requirements.

ENROLLMENT

The student population is approximately 1832 students with a senior class of 425. The racial/ethnic composition consists of: 53.14% Caucasian, 0.76% American Indian or Alaskan, 8.03% Asian, 3.33% Filipino, 3.17% African-American, 0.49% Pacific Islander, and 26.65% identify as Hispanic or Latino. 4.42% identify with two or more races.
