THE SCHOOL

Roseville High School, a public school located 15 miles north of Sacramento, serves students in grades 9-12. The school was founded in 1912 as the first school in the Roseville Joint Union High School District. Roseville High School was honored by the California Department of Education with the 2017 California Gold Ribbon School Award and AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) National Demonstration site distinction. Roseville High School received a full six-year accreditation in 2015 from the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC). Roseville High School is on a four-by-four block schedule which allows students to explore more electives over their four years. The school features a wide variety of AP Courses and opportunities to explore careers through Career Technical Education courses in Media/Journalism, Culinary/Hospitality, Computer Science and Project Lead the Way Bio Medical and Engineering programs.

ENROLLMENT

The student population is approximately 2004 students with a senior class of 539. In the 2016-2017 school year, the racial/ethnic composition consisted of: 59.56% Caucasian, 0.48% American Indian or Alaskan, 5.17% Asian, 4.44% Filipino, 3.80% African-American, 0.74% Pacific Islander, and 24.02% identify as Hispanic or Latino. 1.80% identify with two or more races.
