THE SCHOOL

Roseville High School is a public school located in the community of Roseville fifteen miles north of Sacramento. The attendance area serves the northeastern part of the city of Roseville. It is primarily a suburban middle class community. The school, which serves grades 9-12, received a full six-year accreditation in 2009, from the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC).

Roseville High School is on a four-by-four block schedule with the school year split into two 18-week terms. Students are enrolled in four classes each term, which is equivalent to two traditional semesters. Therefore, each semester-long course at Roseville High School is equal to a yearlong course in a traditional high school.

ENROLLMENT

The student population is approximately 2,007 students with a senior class of 484. The racial/ethnic composition consists of: 65.9% Caucasian, 16.3% American Indian or Alaskan, 5.2% Asian, 5.2% Filipino, 4.8% African-American, 1.3% Pacific Islander, 1.2% not specified, and 22.8% identify as Hispanic or Latino.
