THE SCHOOL

Roseville High School, a public school located 15 miles north of Sacramento, serves students in grades 9-12. The school was founded in 1912 as the first school in the Roseville Joint Union High School District. Roseville High School received a full six-year accreditation in 2015 from the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) as was recently named a U.S. News & World Report Silver Medal School.

Roseville High School is on a four-by-four block schedule with the school year split into two 18-week terms. Students are enrolled in four classes each term, which is equivalent to two traditional semesters. Therefore, each semester-long course at Roseville High School is equal to a yearlong course in a traditional high school.

ENROLLMENT

The student population is approximately 2000 students with a senior class of 434. In the 2014-2015 school year, the racial/ethnic composition consisted of: 60.4% Caucasian, 0.5% American Indian or Alaskan, 4.7% Asian, 4.4% Filipino, 3.5% African-American, 0.9% Pacific Islander, and 23% identify as Hispanic or Latino. 2.6% identify with two or more races.
