Intervention and Support “Every student, every class, every day”

“Breaking Down the Walls” – week of October 30- Unify, empower, and engage every student to create a positive and supportive campus climate.

Started Intervention period last year – 3.1% increase in A’s and B’s, 1.7% decrease in D’s and F’s

On Campus Credit Recovery – new this year. Taught after school by RHS teachers (rather than at Independence High School)

College readiness – Increased STEM programs (computer science, Bio Med, Engineering – steady enrollment) – over 500 students
