### I. PRIOR BUSINESS- Keri Smith:

- a. Septemeber 2015 meeting minutes were reviewed and approved. John Enos motioned to approve meeting minutes, seconded by Keri Smith. All in favor: All. All apposed: None.

### II. BUDGET - Anita Kwong

- a. Collected \$240 in membership dues. Total funds in account is \$8942.29

### III. STUDENT ACTIVITIES, Ms. Lindsey Parker & London Bones (ASB treasurer, Junior)

- a. *Pink Out Rally* with Good Day Sacramento was a big success on Friday 10/16. Held from 6AM-7:40AM. 300-400 students attended. Lots of sports and breast cancer awareness.
- b. Tuesday (10/13) *Movie Night* played Hocus Pocus (voted by students). Good movie date!
- c. *Red Ribbon Week* Assembly held by Peer Helping on Monday 10/19: Focus was for students who have been indirectly, or directly, affected by drug abuse.
- d. *Bonfire Rally* is Thursday (10/29) held right after the freshman football game. Open performance auditions took place the week prior (10/13 & 10/15). Admission is free.
- e. *Canned Food Drive*: Classes having a competition for a pizza party during 2<sup>nd</sup> period. Goal: if every student brought 10 cans, we'd collect about 2000 cans. Benefits the Roseville Salvation Army.

### IV. GUEST SPEAKERS: ACADEMY OF DRIVING Jashua & Maurice Arce

- a. Jashua is a RHS Alum, Maurice retired from DMV after working there for over 30 years. They started the driving school to develop good, safe drivers
- b. Reviewed the process of getting teens started. Some of the highlights included: student needs to have a permit for 6 months. Drive 50 hours w/parents. 6 hours of training w/driving school (via 5 sessions). Can cancel/postpone sessions any time (no fee to reschedule). You also pay as you go. Students can get permit at 15 1/2 and must be 16 to be eligible to take driving test. Driving schools makes DMV appt. They use academy cars to take students to the actual test.
- c. They teach parallel parking, uphill and downhill parking -- and emphasize defensive driving.
- d. No insurance is required when students have a permit. And permit is not valid until the first driving session is held.
- e. DMV cost is \$33. Test will include a vision test, thumbprint, and picture. Teens need to bring birth certificate.
- f. Cannot drive from 11PM to 5AM, and NO passengers under 20. Plus parents have a right to cancel license if under 18.

### V. GUEST SPEAKER – Officer Lynn. Lead Investigator/Driving Instruction/Motorcycle Instruction, Roseville PD

- a. Shared story on son getting his license -- and showed us a teen's driver's license (it's vertical instead of horizontal).
- b. Discussed how expensive tickets can be, as well as insurance issues.
- c. Said streets are extremely dangerous at night. Twice as dangerous 12AM-1AM. And three times as dangerous at 2AM.
- d. Shared stories on parking lot accidents. Stated they're hard to proof. Usually a common sense issue.
- e. Suggested for parents to have good insurance.
- f. Stated that PD doesn't usually go to accidents on private properties, when they're too busy, or when there's only property damage. Suggested parents keep a "driver's info exchange form," which is avail. via insurance companies.
- g. Elder's commit a lot of hit and runs. And hit and runs barely get prosecuted.
- h. Discussed "Hands-Free" provisions, and stated legislation needs to catch-up. Suggested that we don't talk, don't text, and to turn the phone off and put it away.
