1. Call to order at 5:01pm
2. Approval of Minutes: December Minutes Approved
 - a. Motion made by Clarice Swaney
 - b. Seconded by Jay Hester
 - c. Unanimous approval
3. Committee Reports
 - a. Student Report
 - i. Finals just passed and today was the first day back from Winter break
 - ii. Back to school night
 - b. Staff Report
 - i. English department had a meeting about the District Common Assessment and more kids are going from a 2 to a 3 (passing)
 - ii. At Back to School night there will be a representative from Sierra College and Wellness Center representatives who will speak to parents
 - iii. For administration, registration planning is beginning
 - iv. Parent, staff, and student surveys are being sent out this month
 - c. ELAC Report
 - i. Another meeting will be in 2 weeks
 - ii. They recently had a meeting where they described the program
4. New Business
 - a. Comprehensive Safe School Plan
 - i. School safety committee is close to finalizing an after-school safety plan which would include collaborating with athletics and custodians
 - ii. Explanation of the safety committee's goals about safety procedures, parent events, student support groups through the wellness staff, etc.
 - iii. Staff in more susceptible areas (i.e. Culinary) will be educated on important safety tips
 - iv. Plan is to work with the monthly newsletter to keep the community updated on important safety things
 - v. Catapult is the safety program that is being rolled out to all staff to make a chaotic event as structured as possible
 - vi. The safety committee wants to have heimlich signs posted in the cafeteria

- vii. They also want to have larger hall and room signs to make the campus a more welcoming environment and accessible for all
 - viii. An idea that was brought up, not part of this year's safety plan, was to give teachers access to every room on campus
 - ix. Motion made by Alyssa Schmidt
 - x. Seconded by Clarice Swaney
 - xi. Unanimous approval
- b. Supporting Student Athletes
- i. Earlier in the year, there was an OCR complaint made against Oakmont involving a special needs student trying out for a sport here on campus
 - ii. The CIF and San Joaquin section are strongly supportive of accommodations for students with special needs
 - iii. In response, Rob Hasty made a presentation for the coaches to train them on the code of conduct
 - iv. In the OCR complaint, Oakmont was not found to be at fault yet they are still choosing to educate coaches more on the subject
- c. Review of Budget and Spending Goals Adopted 19/20
- i. The budget sheet shows that the input received from the surveys taken by parents and students is being listened to
 - ii. For instance, the concern of parents about students' stress levels and well-being lead to more funding toward the wellness center, 5th period, etc.
 - iii. Question raised about what is the PSAT for all 10th graders for free and the program and its importance for college acceptance was explained
 - iv. District Wide Math Coach is no longer working for the district, and instead the district has written grants and they are dramatically changing how they teach math
 - v. Questions raised about number 10 and number 5, considering more money is being spent on counseling services and a lot less money on making teachers improve for the classroom
 - vi. In response, there was more grant money used for item 5, professional development, and there is an overwhelming amount of PD for staff in the district
 - vii. Plus, the mental health issue is being strongly tackled by the district and our wellness staff here at Oakmont, so increasing amounts of money is being allocated toward that
 - viii. Comment made by staff that a lot of the PD is focused on tech training, equity training, etc. and not enough opportunities to improve on actual teaching and subject-specific trainings for teachers
 - ix. Question raised about item 35, which raised from \$800 to \$35,000 and there was not an answer provided
 - x. Question on item 8 on why the budget has decreased for library extended hours, the answer was that the services provided are still the same

- d. District FPM Visit
 - i. The visit lead to required adjustments to the single-school plan
 - ii. Now, the budget has to go on the plan
 - iii. \$1,000 allocated to parent meetings focusing on under-represented student groups - no change
 - iv. \$4,000 for sending counselors to UC meetings - no change
 - v. \$1,000 use 8th grade registration as a time parents can access information on a-g requirements - no change thus no change in goal number one
 - vi. \$15,083 for growth in both math action plans for CAASPP growth - increased amount from about \$10,000
 - vii. \$14,083 which is an ELA action plans for CAASPP growth - increased amount from last year
 - viii. \$433,449 for ongoing education support across all academic content areas (ELD, site funds, Health Academy)
 - ix. \$12,000 for teacher tutors and \$3,200 for student tutors to continue further development of 5th period in the library for EL, low SES, and struggling students - which is newly added to the document
 - x. \$5,000 for paper, snacks, etc. for 5th period
 - xi. \$28,134 for supplemental materials for ELD classes and EL students - big change and growth
 - xii. \$3,000 to develop and host the "Speaker Series" for parents which discuss important topics - no change
 - xiii. \$8,000 for translation of key school documents into student's home languages, due to Oakmont's large Spanish-speaking population
 - xiv. \$7,000 for Breaking Down the Walls and/or Point Break so that students understand each other better, yet there has not been a date set for this Spring yet
 - xv. \$5,757 and \$1,000 to continue campus-wide involvement in PBIS which includes prizes and training - no change
 - xvi. \$2,000, \$2,000, and \$3,000 for 8th grade CTE recruitment - no change
 - xvii. \$5,000 for increased student internship placement
 - xviii. \$200,475 and \$40,000 allocated for the CTE programs which are receiving Crane or Perkins grants to support those programs - no change
 - xix. Review of budget breakdown by goal and fund
 - xx. Motion made by Clarice Swaney
 - xxi. Seconded by Gina Stahlecker
 - xxii. Unanimous Approval
- e. District is using a CSI group to narrow down to 5 to 6 areas to ensure that the LCAP matches the single school plan which matches the CSI plan so that everything is aligned
 - i. Next meeting we will see the document sent out by the superintendent and review to make sure that our goals align
