- A. Students: Everyone was kind of disappointed about the sports thing. Looking forward to updates next year. Successful can food drive, doing a clothing drive this week.

- B. Staff: Getting ready for spring. Looking at what leadership is going to do.

1. Hasty: Talked to PAC about: Theater lighting is going to be replaced on a periodic basis, approved from the district (100,000\$ to improve). Football scoreboard is being replaced. Boiler rooms were being updated and are finishing up, so now we have heat and hot water throughout the campus. CIF athletics got postponed to Jan 1st at the earliest. CDPH and govern office will help determine what CIF (sports) does about the seasons.

- a) At what point are we ok with sports not being in the yearbook if sports keep being pushed back?

- b) We will keep in contact to see what we can do. Probably will see how long we can wait before we make the decision.

- VI. Unfinished Business

- A. RSVLA vs. Online (Hasty)

1. Now in the process of building master schedules to see how RSVLA is being staffed. Mike Fischer and Marie Criste are the ones overseeing the master schedule at RSVLA. They should be done this week. Hasty has begun working on seeing what holes are being fit. Because all the transfers were made based on needs and seniority. And example: one department lost 4 teachers, and as we had a need to meet our staff vs. students we will be getting new teachers from other sites. We will be

losing some teachers because we are overstaffed in some areas and other sites may be understaffed. It is a difficult and messy process. We are getting close at Oakmont to know how we are going to be impacted and where teachers are going to be moving. Master schedule is looking good so far.

a) Abigail: RSVLA is separate, but if the scenario is that we go back into lockdown will we go back to online again?

(1) This could look different, as things are changing. Try to accomplish allowing for students to do Hybrid if they part of a specialty program. Anticipated we could go back and forth depending on where we are in COVID. It is a decision that is being made in conjunction with what is being said by CDPH.

B. Positive COVID Cases - How do we communicate?

1. Bobbie: If we have the kids go back to school and we get a surge on campus, what happens?

a) Need to hit 5% of our population (student and staff of ALL, including people at home) to test positive in a 2 week period for our site to close down. For the whole district it would be 25% positive for the district. What has been happening because of FERPA is we need to be confidential about what we release because people are attacking those who are positive. There should be no shame in people getting COVID.

b) Need to tell parents, that it is the whole population not just those on campus.

c) Anticipating the spike because of the breaks.

d) County knows even if they don't report to the school is they are positive.

e) We know that a large number of people who aren't going to get tested, but that is outside of our control.

2. When do we know the schedules are going out to families for the academy?

a) Hope we will have it in 2 weeks or so. As far as what is being taught is the independence high school curriculum.

b) How is that going to be impacting the people who are here? How are we collapsing classes?

(1) We are going to have more numbers in different classes, some are going to be high, some are going to be low.

(a) How does that play into COVID?

(i) It is going to be messy.

3. When will teachers be getting their schedules?

a) Hope is a week in half or so. We haven't begun to tackle in detail who is in Hybrid or not.

- (1) Anticipate that the opposite of what happened in Hybrid to happen, people will get to come back. We will try to let kids come back, but as for spacing it may not allow it.
 - (a) Right now kids are coming and going as they please. Can they still do this on the new schedule?
 - (i) Nope, once you choose you choose. We will only allow for it if it is better for the teacher, and unless the student is sick and you are teaching hybrid mode then they could do it. Go through the same process of missing class to make sure students don't take advantage of that.
4. Are we looking at running hybrid for classes for students who are quarantine?
 - a) Case by case basis.
 - b) To piggy back on that: If my student is out for 7-10 days if there is nothing available to him because he has to be quarantine?
 - (1) Again, case by case basis. If the number is low we would be just running it like it would be a sick.
 - (2) HUB will be there to help address the need.

Going to try to take this to the district to implement this behavioral threat assessment plan.
