V.Opportunity for Public Input:

1. Deanna Ponseti: Most things seem to have been approved by the district instead of being generated from the site council concern. Trying to find out what the purpose of site council is and if a school did have the control to tell the District no. Is this the opportunity to be able to discuss curriculum?
 - i. There is a sense of responsibility for our school site council to have base line understanding of what is happening here.
 - ii. A lot of the material is already vetted prior to getting into site council agenda
2. Karen Combest: Some concerns for the school site plan.
 - i. For goal one want to see the engagement in the counselors noted here as an important item. Would like to see some action there for the Junior year, feel like the counselors could spend more time with Juniors to prepare them for applying for colleges. Like to see college application sessions and they happen very early on next year.
 1. Amy Price does do something like this on a consistent basis at the beginning of year.
 2. Lorri Perkins: Counselors do a Junior lesson and a google classroom for all students to be able to access based on their college graduation year. This year the Junior year and Senior class did miss out because of COVID, but all the information was available it was just needed to be accessed by the students. If there is any question parents are always able to contact their counselors.
 3. Jay Hester: The problem will be staffing for this process.
 - ii. General: There is a lot of terminology in the school site plan that is not accessible for the general public. Would like a key to identify the different acronyms. There is a lot of identified cohorts, and was wondering where does her student fall in if she doesn't fit into one of the identified cohorts?
 1. We did work as a school site council at the beginning of the year to explain what the purpose of school site council. Generally speaking the school site plan is for state allocated funds for specific cohorts. RJUHSD does both for the school site plan so we see the funding for all students not just for the cohorts.
